## (2) Speed Watch

Session held at our more frequent time of 8-9 am recorded 6% speeding. The session held between 4 and 5 pm which is a time motorists are not used to seeing us in Gorefield had 21% recorded as speeding.

The highest percentages recorded at over 30 mph are in the tolerance level permitted 31 -34 mph. 20% and 32%

We have not been able to fill all the session times (1 hour slots from 8am until 6pm) that were proposed on the all day speed watch for Gorefield happening in May but the session times that volunteers have signed up for will go ahead.

Councillors suggested that information be put on face book again and possibly a leaflet drop again to try to encourage more volunteers from Gorefield.

# (3) Reports from Cambridgeshire and Fenland DC Councillors

Councillor King reported that he had recently met the Local Highway Manager for Fenland and Huntingdon and the new Local Highways Officer for Gorefield, Alex Edgoose who takes up her post on 13<sup>th</sup> May.

Despite numerous emails and repeated phone calls regarding bus stops in the village no response has come from the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority, whose responsibility this is.

With regard to 45 Back Road 5 Back Rd The Local Highway Manager for Fenland and Huntingdon is chasing up the boundary map.

With regard to Oxfield Drove adoption Councillor King has spoken to the Head of Leisure and Open Spaces, Fenland District Council. Unfortunately there is a disagreement with the developers, Tilia Homes, about the open space area boundary to be adopted so this is likely to take some time to progress. There is no further update from Tilia about the Deed of Grant of Easement.

Gote Lane/High Road drainage update from the Assistant Design Engineer, Design & Delivery:

"I hope to get the design checked and approved for costing by end of April. I can share the designs once this stage is complete"

The Local Highway Manager Fenland and Huntingdon has confirmed that all the following have been repaired:

#### Planning applications:

**F/YR24/0304/F** - Change of use of land to gypsy traveler's plot involving the siting of 2 residential mobile homes and 2 touring caravans, the formation of hardstanding, in filling of ditch (to create vehicular access) and erection of 1.8 m high fencing and a gate with 2.15 m high brick piers (retrospective) at land east of Fern House Birds Drove – this is development in the open countryside with no justification.

F/YR24/0312/RM – Reserved matters application relating to detailed matters of access, appearance, landscaping, layout and scale (Plot 5 only) pursuant to outline permission F/YR23/0548/O to erect up to 1 dwelling (2 storey 4 bed) with detached garage at land west of 176 High Road 9 - Gorefield Parish Council have no objections with what is proposed for this site but are still very concerned with the access which is very near the junction with Hassockhill Drove and there is no footpath on either side of the road at this point.
